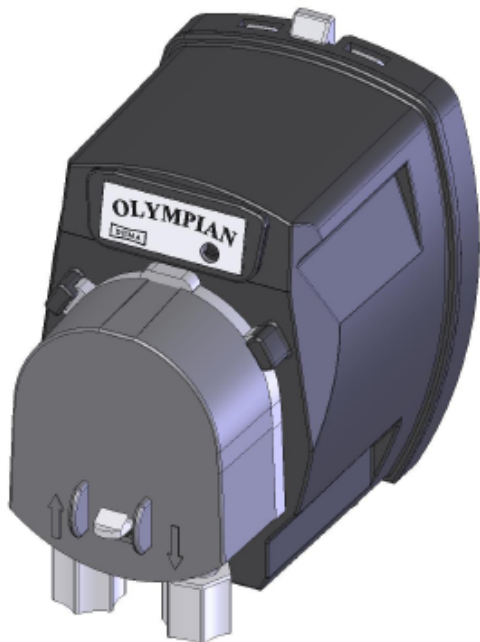


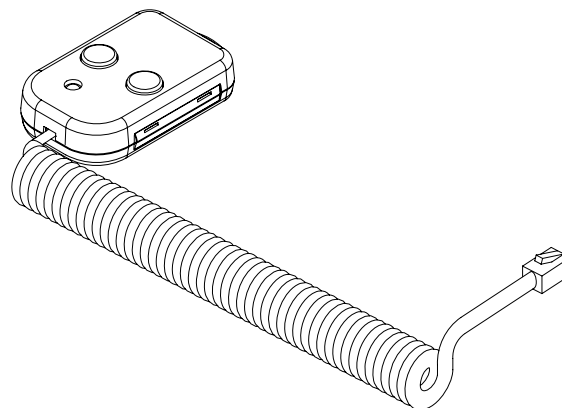
DEMA® Olympian

 O-RDV & O-RHV (Blue)
 O-SDV & O-SHV (Yellow)



Please read all instructions before proceeding with the Olympian installation.

PURPOSE:

The Olympian™ rinse and sanitizer warewash systems control chemical delivery functions for door-type dish machines and similar warewash applications. They require an 81-245-1 Two Button Programmer (see below) to set up the initial programming. Only one Two Button Programmer is required as it can be used to program as many Olympian models as desired.

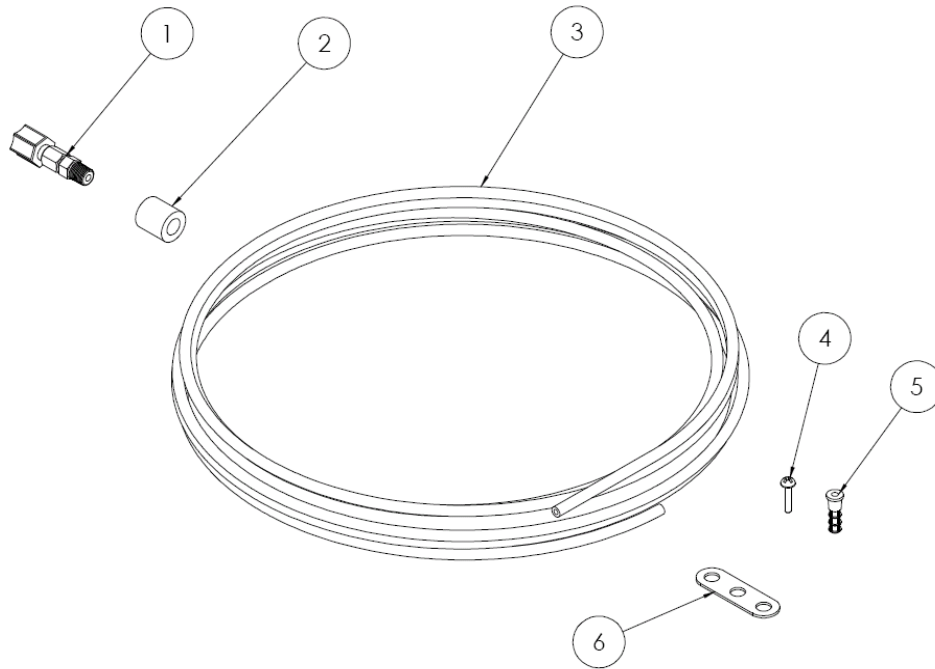

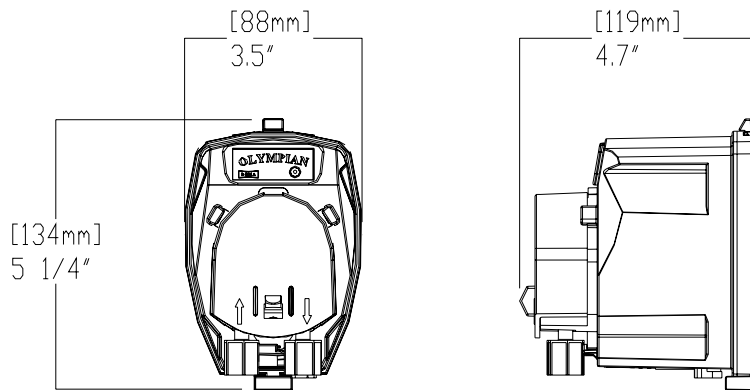

ELECTRICAL INSTALLATION:

All installations must be in accordance with city, county, parish, state, or provincial electrical codes and be performed by a certified electrician. For questions, please contact a local licensed electrical contractor.

1. All electrical power must be turned off to the dish or cleaning machine and any other circuit that is to be used for this installation. Lockout and tag procedures must be observed when installing this device. Never open the Olympian enclosure while power is applied. Signals may be active from the dish or cleaning machine, even with Olympian power turned off. Use appropriately rated insulated wiring, electrical fixtures, and other materials that meet all applicable electrical and building codes.

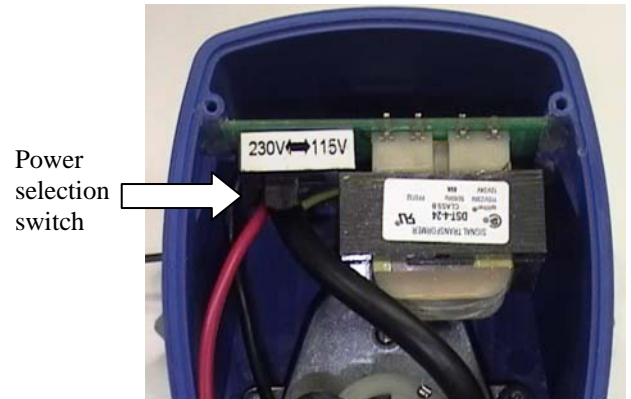


Figure 1. Input Voltage Switch

2. **O-RDV Controls Only:** This control has a switch to select the proper line voltage. The unit is factory set to 230VAC. To change the voltage to 115VAC, remove the back of the control. Move the switch from 230VAC to 115VAC as shown in Figure 1. Reinstall the back cover.
WARNING: This must be done *before* connecting power to the unit.
3. Connect to the appropriate power source.

TUBING INSTALLATION:

1. Install weight and weight retainer as shown in Figure 2.
2. Place weight and retainer in chemical container.
3. Cut tubing to the appropriate length. Attach tubing to the pump inlet.
4. Attach outlet tubing to pump outlet and to dish or cleaning machine. Attach outlet tubing to injection check valve (904-8T or 904-8T).

PROGRAMMING:

NOTE: Due to the short wash and rinse cycles, the programming of the unit may require several wash cycles.

Step 1: Apply power.

Step 2: Remove the cover and connect the Two Button Programmer as shown in Figure 3.

Step 3: Push either button on the programmer to toggle the LED to the desired program mode as shown in Figure 4. See below for the program mode.

1	Delay	Yellow	Amount of time delay between power and pumping of rinse additive	Push both buttons to start delay time and both buttons to stop delay time	0 Seconds
2	Pump Speed	Green	Speed of pump	Push both buttons to enter programming mode. Push left button to reduce speed. Push right button to increase speed	100% (Maximum speed)
3	Rinse Limit	Red	Active = Pump will stop running after 18 seconds of power. Inactive = Pump will run until power is turned off.	Push either button to toggle the LED on the programmer. On = Activates rinse limit Off = Pump runs until power is turned off	Active

On = Limit is active
Off = Limit is inactive

Step 4: Push both buttons, simultaneously, to start programming the time or enter program mode.

Step 5: Push both buttons, simultaneously, to stop time or exit the program mode.

Step 6: Repeat steps 3-5 for each program mode.

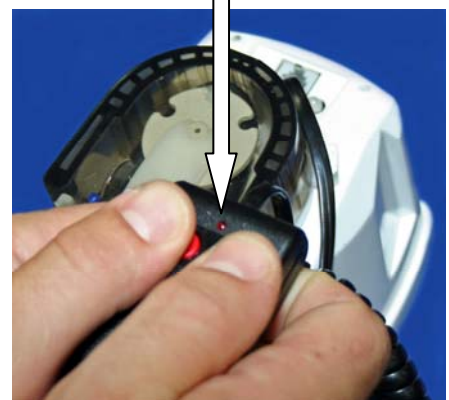
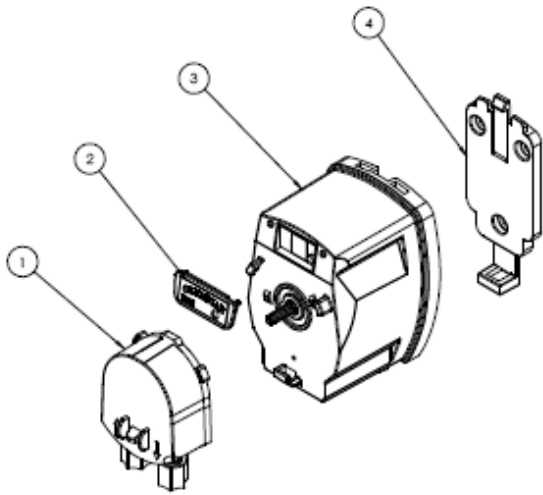
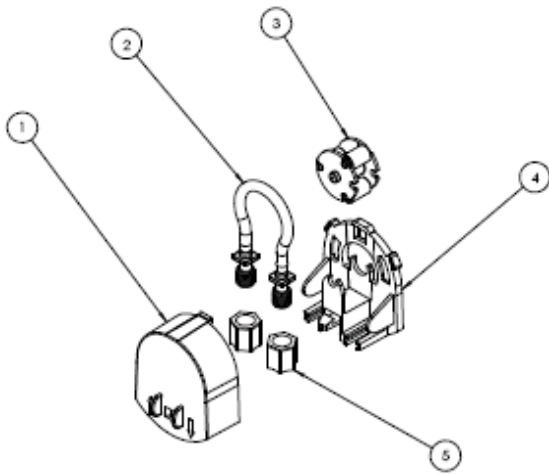


Figure 5. Programming Start / Stop

Step 7: After the Olympian Unit has been programmed with the desired values, remove the Two Button Programmer from the Olympian programming jack and replace the Olympian cover.
